The Stanton Bird Club is pleased to continue our 11th year of **Guided Bird Walks** in the Lewiston / Auburn area. All walks are **free** and open to everyone, beginning naturalist to advanced birder. Walks are led by Stan and Joan DeOrsey, who identify and comment on birds seen and heard.

Anyone interested in walking, seeing new places, fresh air, and nature is welcomed. Walks are held in a variety of interesting and diverse local habitats, plus some areas less often visited. Please mark your calendar and join us every other Wednesday on the dates listed, or pick and choose the one or two which most interest you.

- May 2 Papermill Trail, Lisbon
Meet at the boat launch parking lot at Frost Hill Rd. on Route 196, Lisbon
- May 16 Bill Sylvester's home, Auburn
Meet at the Sylvester home, 1128 Riverside Dr., Auburn at **7:30AM**
- May 30 Chuck Peter's home, New Gloucester
Meet at the Peter's home, 40 Underpass Rd. off Cobbs Bridge Rd. *immediately* on the right after the railroad underpass
- June 13 Androscoggin Riverlands State Park, Turner
Meet at the boat launch on the west end of the Center Bridge Rd. bridge, Turner
- June 27 Brunswick Landing, Brunswick (old Naval Air Station)
Meet in the parking area on the right beyond the entrance off the Bath Rd., Brunswick
- July 11 Fitzgerald Preserve, Brunswick
Meet at the preserve, turn left at Lowe's traffic light on Bath Rd. onto Old Bath Rd. Continue 1.3 miles to Lindbergh Crossing on right, park along this road.
- July 25 Riverside Trail, Lewiston
Meet at the corner of Winter and Whipple Sts. in Lewiston at Sunnyside Park

- **Meeting Locations**, as noted above. We now meet at the walk locations and **not** at Staples. If you need better directions or want to car pool, contact Stan (see below).
- All walks **start at 8AM** (except May 16) at the walk location. Walks end by 11AM, but you may leave early.
- Walks will be held even if it is drizzling, but if there is a steady rain at 7AM and projected to continue to 10AM, the walk is canceled.
- Walks are approximately 2 miles on a generally even and basically dry surface.
- Bring binoculars and dress for the weather, layers work very well.
