## **BYLAW CHANGE**

### Article IV. Government

Section 1: The governing body of this corporation shall consist of a Board of eleven members of the corporation. The tenure of office of the Directors shall be two years, at most only six Directors' terms can expire in any one year. Therefore at each annual meeting of the corporation, six members shall be elected to a new term by a majority of the members present in one year and five members shall be elected in the alternate year; due notice having been given in advance to all members. ## Late Summer/Fall 2019 Wednesday Walks

### The Stanton Bird Club is pleased to continue our 12th year of Guided Wednesday Bird Walks.
