Late Summer/Fall 2020 Wednesday Walks

Oct. 21 Packard-Littlefield Farm, Lisbon Meet at the farm, 76 Littlefield Rd. off of Rt. 196

Nov. 4 Sabattus Pond, Sabattus Meet in the parking lot of former Sabattus Antique Mall, 519 Sabattus Rd. (Rt. 126)

All walks start at 8am at the walk location and end by 11am.

All walks are free and open to everyone, beginning naturalist and advanced birder.
